The Colonial grace of Antigua charms with its pastel, sun-faded buildings and colorful street life. Guatemala's rich indigenous culture will inspire you with its proud heritage. Most of all, its friendly people will settle into your heart and give you reason to smile long after you return home. This trip gives participants an opportunity to visit the beautiful country of Guatemala, meet the weavers who make the Corazon Scarves, and participate in service projects and education activities. It is a pleasant balance of exploration, learning, and service.

We will stay in comfortable facilities and enjoy numerous cultural outings. We will learn about the history of Guatemala, including its civil war and indigenous rights campaign.

*This trip is moderately strenuous and participants should be able to walk a mile with ease.*

### *Highlights:*

Tour of colonial Antigua with its ruins, churches, vibrant art, music, food, and culture.

Visits with indigenous artisans and activists.

Listen to stories from survivors of Guatemala's 36-year civil war.

Textile workshop on natural tints.

Exploration of towns surrounding beautiful Lake Atitlan, including San Juan, famous for its murals and textile traditions.

Visit the shrine of Maximón.

Guided tour of the Mayan ruins of Iximche in Tecpan, considered the last Mayan capital of Guatemala.

**Included:** 11 Nights lodging, ten breakfasts, three lunches, three dinners, ground transportation, textile workshop, visit to ruins and museum, donations to visited projects.

**Excluded:** International airfare, airport shuttle, taxi fees, additional meals, personal insurance, tips and trip insurance, and optional activities such as yoga classes and hiking excursions.
