OAXACA, MEXICO

Arrive October 6th - Depart October 15th, 2021

The state of Oaxaca in Southern Mexico is celebrated for its indigenous cultures. These include the Zapotecs and the Mixtec people who proudly preserve their traditional dance, arts, cooking, and festivals. We will meet with women activists and artists who are challenging the patriarchy, determining innovative ways to design and market their traditional arts, and build their communities through sustainable farming. There will be visit to museums, galleries, artists' studios and community festivals. We will stay in simple, but comfortable accommodations in Oaxaca City and the small town of Teotitlan. It will be a balance of exploring and learning.

Participants are required to follow all local Covid-19 protocols.

Covid-19 vaccinations recommended prior to travel

Oaxaca, Mexico Trip Highlights:

- Oaxaca city tour, including an overview of its history and culture, with stops at some of the city's art galleries and historical churches.
- Full-day workshop with the Vida Nueva weavers.
- Time to enjoy the nightly festivities and dancing at the Oaxaca Zolcolo (city square.)
- · Visit to the ruins of Monte Alban.
- Daytrip to village of San Martin Tilcajete to visit the studios of Alejbrije artists.
- Day trip to CEDICAM (Centro Educativo Desarrollo Integral Campesinos Alta Mixteco) to learn about their women's greenhouse program, farm tour and overview of sustainable farming strategies.
- Cooking class with Chef Gerardo Aldeco Pinelo at La Cocina Oaxaqueña will feature an early morning market visit to select fresh food for the day's preparations and will include instructions on making Oaxacan's world famous moles.
